Remembrance of All Saints

P: On this All Saints Day, we remember all who have gone before us and give thanks to our Lord for the promise of resurrection life.

We, as followers of Christ, are connected and woven

together with the saints who have come before us. Their lives and witness have been our anchor to the faith and love of Christ.

C: Today we give thanks for all those who have shown us the faith of Christ in their lives.

P: Today we give thanks to the God who opens the door to eternity for us and for those who have gone before us. Scripture reminds us, not one of us is worthy of the perfect love of God, and yet God wraps us in the righteousness of our Savior and sets a feast before us. Today as we light these candles of remembrance, we remember the light and witness of those who have died, a light which shines within each of us who still wait for the culmination of our faith.

C: May the light of their lives be remembered and the joy of salvation be celebrated.


